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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - only one "must stop" sign <p>Advanced topic about starting/stopping/backing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Emphasize, it is best to read with some knowledge of the meaning so stopping correctly. - When backing up before ٱ sign for example, if one starts at an improper place the sentence can be distorted. Someone who understands Arabic would find it very difficult to listen to recitation that breaks the verse so inappropriately. It may be better not to back up if cannot back up to a meaningful phrase, but make sure to finish off the verse and not leave in the middle. - Some words before which a phrase is generally complete, or where one can back up to: و، ثُمَّ، قُلْ، قَالَ، يَقُول |
