# A Guide for Judgment in Competitions of Recitation of the Holy Quran

Three criteria should be observed when judging in the competitions of recitation of the Holy Quran:

- 1. Accuracy of Pronunciation
- 2. Ease and Expertise in Delivery
- 3. Melodiousness

## 1: Accuracy of Pronunciation

For this criteria, articulation of the letters with their proper sounds and characteristics (*makhaarij* and *sifaat*) should be observed. Some detail of these characteristics is as follows:

- *Tafkheem* (heaviness in articulation) of following letters: خص ضغط قظ; 'نا' in the word الله, preceded by fathah or zammah; 'y' bearing *fathah* or *zammah*, or bearing *sukoon* preceded by *fatha* or *zammah*
- Targeeq (lightness in articulation) of letters (all the rest of the Arabic alphabet)
- *Izhaar* (articulation of ن saakin and ن of tanween clearly and firmly with short sound, followed by any of the 6 throat letters: نُهِعَدَغخ)
- *Ikhfaa* (articulation of ن saakin and ن of tanween softly with nasal sound and prolongation of sound). *Ikhfaa* in saakin followed by ب
- Application of *galgalah*, (in 5 letters of غطب جد)
- Gentleness or firmness of sound,
- Traakhi (softness in articulation with prolongation of the sound) in  $\dot{\upsilon}$  and  $\dot{\sigma}$  bearing tashdeed, and  $\dot{\sigma}$  and  $\dot{\sigma}$  bearing tashdeed preceded by  $\dot{\upsilon}$  saakin or tanween,
- Sur'at (articulation of the letters bearing tashdeed without prolonging the voice over them)
- Qasr and madd, (articulation of short vowels, long vowels and excessive long vowels properly)
- Ftc

# 2: Ease and Expertise in Delivery

• How well and how skillfully the reciter employs the rules of pronunciation in delivery of the verses. And whether the application of the rules sounds natural, and free of strenuous formality and artificiality. [Application of rules should sound natural and not artificial or forced.]

#### 3: Melodiousness

- In addition to correct pronunciation and appropriate application and delivery of the general rules of *tajweed*, it should be determined how skillfully the reciter delivers the verses beautifully, melodiously, and in a way that complements the inherent meaning of the text.
- The level of general appeal and attraction of the recitation should also be noted.

Note: Reciters who wish to appear in the Certification Test for teaching recitation of the Holy Qur'an should concentrate on first two criteria given above.

# 1: Accuracy of Pronunciation

[The following are some of the points that should be observed in determining correct pronunciation:]

- Articulation points (makhaarij) and characteristics (sifaat) of the letters,
- Targeeg (thinness) and tafkheem (thickness, fattening) of letters,
- Izhaar (making clear) or Ikhfaa (hiding) of sound, in saakin letters,
- Application of galgalah,
- · Gentleness or firmness of sound,
- Fluency (sur'at) or paused prolongation (taraakhee) of mushaddad letters,
- Brevity (qasr) of sound or elongation (madd), etc.

## 2: Ease and Appropriateness of Delivery

[The points to consider when judging this criteria are:]

How well and how skillfully the reciter employs the rules of pronunciation in delivery of the
verses. And whether the application of the rules sounds natural, and free of strenuous formality
and artificiality. [Application of rules should sound natural and not artificial or forced.]
